The natural world in our own community is facing great challenges just to survive.

Many of these at risk species go unnoticed, struggling right under our noses.

We would like to call attention to these species in need of conservation before it is too late.

Guidelines

Artists may submit 3 paintings; one species from each; air, land and water using the designated color scheme. To expand our thinking, we are also suggesting artists paint each piece using a unique artistic approach. The three techniques to choose from are: pointillism, abstract, and realism. We are hoping that artists will have fun with this challenge while providing awareness for these species in peril.

Painting technique	pointillism, abstract, realism
---------------------------	--------------------------------

Species habitat	Colors to use
air	Blues and purples
land	Reds and greens
water	Yellows and oranges



Paper: Watercolor paper, hot or cold press, minimum weight 140 lbs

Size: 5 x 7; landscape or portrait

Materials: Artwork must include some watercolor transparent or gouache. Other mediums such as charcoal, graphite, ink and collage are allowed.

IMPORTANT: Clearly print your name, cell phone number, species, title and sale price in pencil on the back of the work.

How to Submit

Entrythingy: Submit your JPEG images between February 1 - April 3, 2023.

Participation is free - no entry fee.

Mail paintings: Postmark deadline is April 3, 2023

Sale of Artwork: Thirty percent of the purchase price of sold art will be donated to D&R Greenway. A check will be sent to the artist within 30 days after the close of the exhibition. Unsold artwork may be picked up at the close of the juried exhibition or will be mailed to the artist.

As required by Congress, each state must write a Wildlife Action Plan. New Jersey's Wildlife Action plan identifies 107 FOCAL species. The animals on this list have been determined by NJDEP to have the greatest need for conservation . [Species at Risk Listing](#)
